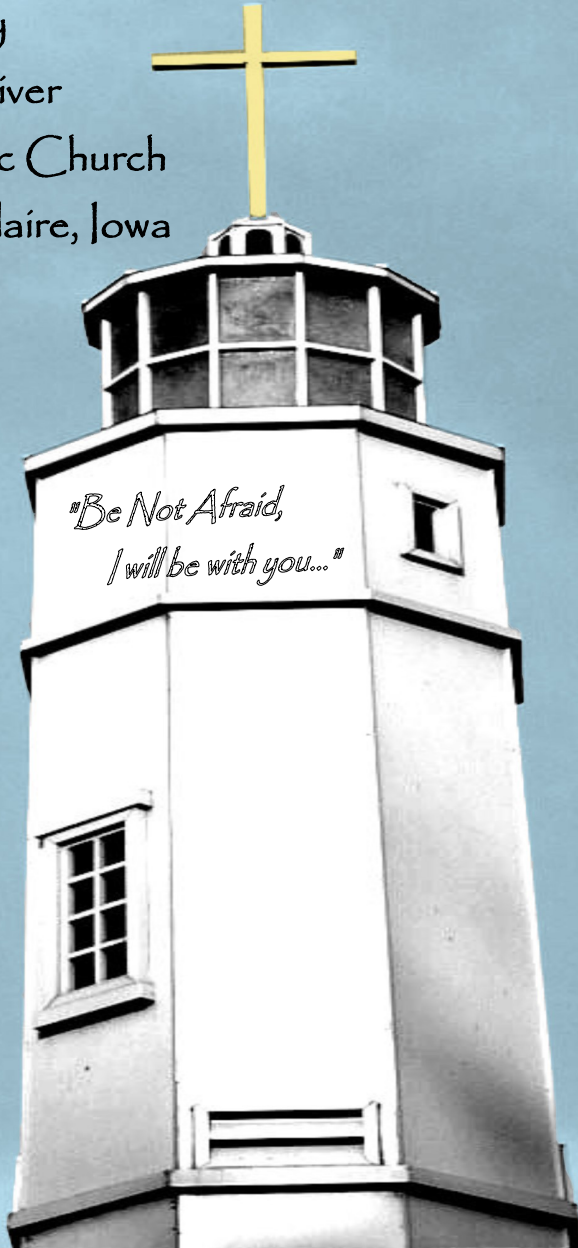

Pastor's Corner



Dear Parishioners,

Last weekend (Feb. 21-23), I had the honor and pleasure to be the spiritual director of the women's Christian Experience Weekend at St. Ann's Church in Long Grove. It was a great experience and Christian journey for more than 30 women before Lent. The food was super, it was my Mardi Gras. Thank you to Fr. Joe and his parishioners for their hospitality.

On Wednesday, March 5, 2025, we will begin another faith journey for 40 days, with the ashes on our foreheads as we hear these words, "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return."

Lent is time when we are encouraged to take time out, "...go to your inner room, close the door, and pray to your Father in secret." Matthew 6:6

Lent invites us to an inner change of heart; a turning to God; a rejection of all that is evil; an opportunity for us to walk in a new direction.

The most asked question during the Lenten season is, "What did you give up?" St. Leo the Great, also known as Pope Saint Leo I, wrote, "What the Christian should be doing at all times should be done now with greater care and devotion, so that the Lenten fast enjoined by the Apostles may be fulfilled not simply by abstinence from food, but above all by the renunciation of sin!" The response to the initial question is very clear: GIVE UP SIN.

The traditional Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving serve us well in overcoming personal sin. St. Peter Chrysologus, Bishop and doctor of the Church, sees these three as being inseparably linked when he says, "Prayer knocks at the door, fasting obtains, mercy receives." (Sermon 43: Office of readings, Third Tuesday in Lent)

Prayer connects us with God and the prayer for excellence is the celebration of the Eucharist.

Fasting, whether from food or from something else, is like a silent prayer that cries out to God, saying we recognize our need for HIM above all else. We hunger more for HIS WORD than for bread.

Almsgiving helps too: any kind of good work is a form of almsgiving.

Let us also nourish our faith during this Lenten season by religious practices typical of Lent: daily Mass, the Stations of the Cross, the rosary or the liturgy of the hours, Chrism Mass, bible study and the beautiful liturgies of Holy Week.

As your Pastor, I invite you to participate in M.A.S.S. every Friday, which stands for Mass at 5:00, Adoration at 5:30, Stations of the Cross, 6:00, Soup Supper immediately following the Stations. Also come to our Communal Penance service on Wednesday, April 9, at 6:00 p.m.

On behalf of my staff and I, we wish you a Happy Easter!

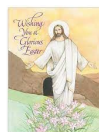

The Music Ministry Team of Our Lady of The River would like to invite anyone who is interested to join our ministry. We welcome anyone who enjoys singing or has a musical talent they would like to share with our parish. If you aren't comfortable being a cantor, but want to participate in some area of singing, we have a spot for you in the choir. Perhaps you have instrumental musical talents, we would welcome you.

Choir – The choir currently practices 30 minutes before the Mass we are scheduled to sing at. If you enjoy being part of a group, like to sing and want to become more involved with our parish, please consider joining the choir. You just have to enjoy singing, no other musical skills needed.

Cantor – To be a cantor, you need to feel comfortable singing solo on the Responsorial Psalm and the Gospel Acclamation. You will be scheduled to cantor at the Mass you prefer, either Saturday evening or Sunday morning. We will meet 30 minutes immediately before your scheduled Mass and review the music for that service.

ServeHAITI

I sometimes find it daunting to write these updates, because it feels like time is moving slowly for the country of Haiti and it can feel like nothing of huge note is actually happening. This is wholly wrong because the fact that the clinic continues to operate and sees over 100 patients a day is nothing short of a miracle during these difficult times. That could not happen without your support so I hope that gives you a sense of purpose and joy in these winter days.

I was cleaning out my office (sporadically) during the last two weeks and came across my journals from my first 4 years of trips to Grand-Bois. I was a very young 42 year old who had lost my mom 2 years earlier. It was so interesting for me to read the words of a scared, out of her element with a total lack of confidence woman who had no idea what she had gotten herself into. I was so fortunate to be traveling with one of my "big" sisters, Cindy, who had totally inspired me to go into nursing, and my baby brother, Jim, who instigated the whole trip. Little did I know as I was writing, that the entire course of my life was taking a huge turn. I thought you might enjoy my first entry to give you an idea of just how ill-equipped I was, which just goes to show that we are all capable of more than we think we are.

Feb 15, 2002 9:15 pm

Oh my God!! Literally!! What a 24 hours it has been. We are in Port au Prince (PAP) at Hospice Saint Joseph - an outreach for traveling missionaries run by nuns and volunteers, who also help facilitate Visas and other paperwork for Haitians who need treatment in other countries. We've taken (cold) showers and are settling in for the night. The trip has already been something out of a movie, staying last night in Atlanta and leaving early this morning for PAP. The trip went relatively smoothly except for having to finagle some duffel repacking to make sure they were all under 70#.

When we arrived at the PAP airport, negotiations (bribes) through customs did not go well and we were horrified to have half of our bags (28) confiscated. We assumed they would go onto the black market and we would never see them again. Fortunately, Tom (Reichert - from ATL, who was the try coordinator) spoke with Father Boniface and one of the interpreters who had connections and a call was placed to the palace. President Aristide's wife made a phone call and miracles happened. Three of our vehicles were called back to the airport to pick up all 28 bags and nothing was missing!! God is so good.

The drive from the airport through the streets is hard to describe. I felt like we had landed on another planet. It was heartbreaking to see so many disabled adults and children begging at the airport. We were instructed not to give anything, as it would cause a riot. Once we were all accounted for in our caravan of 5 vehicles we drove through a maze of twists and turns, up and down hills and so many vendors lining the sides of the streets, I don't know how we didn't run over someone. Our drivers were also our volunteers, so I have to say they did an incredible job of staying together and not losing sight of Pere Boniface, especially since there are virtually no traffic lights/stops (*see page 16 for picture of traveling companions*).

The people in Haiti are physically beautiful; hair done up, clothes pressed and postures proud. They kind of put Americans and our casual way of dressing to shame. Goats and dogs were running back and forth across the road and there were large brightly colored open buses with religious paintings and bible verses called Taptaps everywhere you looked, stuffed with people riding from one stop to another. When we arrived at the Hospice, it was like driving through locked gates into a small oasis. It was set at the top of a huge hill and open air balconies led into our individual rooms. You were locked away from the madness, but you could still hear the horns honking, roosters crowing, people singing and parents calling for their children. It really was surreal. I feel so blessed to be here with so many talented giving people and I feel a terrible case of Imposter Syndrome coming on. How did I get here, and can I really help? My anxiety level is sky-high, I feel so inadequate. The high point of my day was opening a zipper of my fanny pack looking for chapstick as our plane descended into the PAP airport and finding notes from both (my sons) Mike and Clay. I would love for them to experience something like this someday. I'm very homesick tonight, going through pictures I brought and praying that I am doing the right thing. Time to read Stations of the Cross!

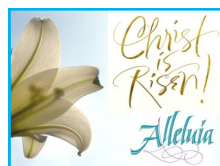

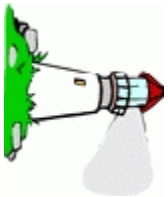

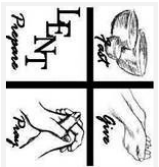
