


A new season and a new school year are also an opportunity for us to consider our own spiritual growth. How might God be calling you to learn

## St. Pierre/ServeHAITI

I ran out of time getting the last update written, as I was preparing for my youngest son's wedding in Italy. It was a wonderful trip that was filled with love, joy, wonder and gratitude. Since coming home on the first of June, life feels a little out of control. Don't we all have so much going on in our lives? Some of it - so, so joyful - but also, some things we are dealing with are scary, sorrowful, monotonous, dreary, painful or just plain chaotic. When I find myself becoming overwhelmed, I really have to stop myself and think about how fortunate I am to be dealing with the ups and downs of daily life in a developed country, as opposed to a country like Haiti. I feel ashamed when I become frustrated over the lack of hours in a day, and then remember that I have electricity, so my time is not encumbered by the constraints of sunlight availability. I have instant access to clean water to wash the sleep out of my eyes in the morning and to drink from a refreshing glass after the dehydrating night of sleep, to brush my teeth, to run my dishwasher and washing machine. I'm even unencumbered by constraints of a weather forecast of rain when I need to dry my clothes. The roads I drive on to run my errands are smooth, with traffic flowing thanks to traffic lights, and I actually have a vehicle and access to gasoline! I have the luxury of growing some tomatoes and even flowers, using my garden hose to make sure that my planting efforts are not for naught, regardless of rainfall amounts.

When guests come to stay, I have the ability to make a run to the grocery store to buy food and drink to serve them, as well as the ability to offer them a comfortable bed with clean sheets.

One of my simple pleasures is keeping several hummingbird feeders full of fresh homemade nectar around my front porch. It's time consuming to keep the

feeders washed and refreshed at least weekly (more in the hot weather) but it brings me joy, and even the fact that I have access to decent amounts of sugar to be able to do that is something that my friends in Haiti can only dream of. In light of the fact that I am getting old, I have been trying to fit exercise into my daily routine. I can afford a comfortable pair of walking shoes and take time to walk on the bike path, listening to music or podcasts and feeling some much welcome respite from the bustle of the day and the onslaught of news. My friends in Haiti rise early and walk miles in sandals or whatever shoes they may have, but not for recreation or “self care”. They walk out of necessity to make sure they can have food for meals that day or water for drinking, washing clothes, cooking and hygiene.

I could go on and on, but I guess it hit me that, I can't make their lives easier in a million different ways, compared to the relative ease of mine. What I can do is whatever is in my power to make sure that they at least continue to have access to clean water and quality healthcare.

Thank you for doing the same. Volunteers in DeWitt held a Trivia Night Fundraiser for ServeHAITI on September 8th and raised over \$24,000. Board Member and Treasurer Greg Amoroso flew from Atlanta to attend and spoke, his words touched me to the core. He said that although ServeHAITI began in Atlanta in 2001, that the volunteers in Iowa and Illinois had quickly become an integral part of the organization. He said that it was irrefutable that ServeHAITI and the clinic in Grand-Bois would not still be in existence without the support of the Quad Cities. That is an amazing statement. Thank you for caring and for all you do to support the parish of St. Pierre and the clinic.


